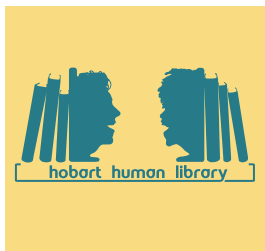
Let's Get Together is a broad-based diversity education program available to schools as a flexible learning package with local support. It has been specifically designed to address discrimination and support the Respectful Schools, Respectful Relationships, and Countering Bullying initiatives.

Living In Between, run in partnership with the Students Against Racism and TasTAFE, is offered as a series of workshops for schools or a short presentation for workplaces, community groups and public events. The program won the 2015 Australian Human Rights Racism It Stops With Me Award.

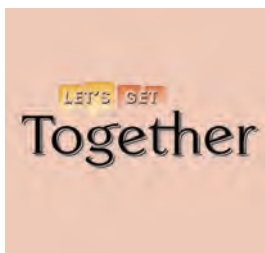


Programs, lessons and presentations to engage students from K to 12 and meet curriculum needs on human rights, diversity and discrimination, social justice, global poverty and taking action.
