Who is the Tasmanian Centre for Global Learning?

The Tasmanian Centre for Global Learning (TCGL) is a Tasmanian non-profit organisation that empowers schools and the wider community to take action for social justice, peace, and a sustainable world future. We do this by providing access to education programs, training, resources, and networks. Our primary focus is supporting Tasmanian teachers to implement key aspects of state and national curricula, specifically those that relate to responsible citizenship, sustainability, values and global perspectives.

Who is Bahay Tuluyan?

Bahay Tuluyan is a Filipino non-profit organisation that empowers street children in the Philippines to look after themselves and fellow children. Bahay Tuluyan offers opportunities for young Australians to volunteer at its Centres each summer and each year brings two former street children to tour Australia to tell their incredible personal stories. The tour, called *Kids View*, which has come to Tasmania every year since 2006, aims to promote children's rights and is very highly regarded.

Kids View 2010

Kids View will be touring Tasmania again in April 2010, supported by AusAID. The tour will consist of forums at schools around the state. Each school that attends the forum will be invited to participate in an ongoing project to learn about the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).

We will be assisting the schools with their project, providing them with resources and partnering the school with a project or organisation (like Bahay Tuluyan) in a developing country. The aim of the partnership will be to work together towards achievement of one of the MDGs.

Role of the MDG Champion

This could be you!

We are looking for outstanding young people (18-25 years old) with a passion for social justice to be a part of *Kids View 2010* in Tasmania, as 'MDG Champions'. Your role will be to inspire and assist students working on the project at one of the schools.

If you already have a connection with a non-profit organisation in a developing country, we will investigate whether the school can support that organisation.

To be selected you will need to commit

- To a one day training session in mid to late April, 2010, and
- A one day school forum in late April, 2010, and
- To maintaining regular contact with students at 1 school between June 2010 and August 2010.

To apply to be a MDG Champion

At this stage we are seeking Expressions of Interest. Please send Mary Dickins an email mary@afairerworld.org with: your name, age, contact details, one paragraph outlining your interest and what you think you can bring to the project, and the contact details for one referee.

If successful you will need to provide a police clearance.
